

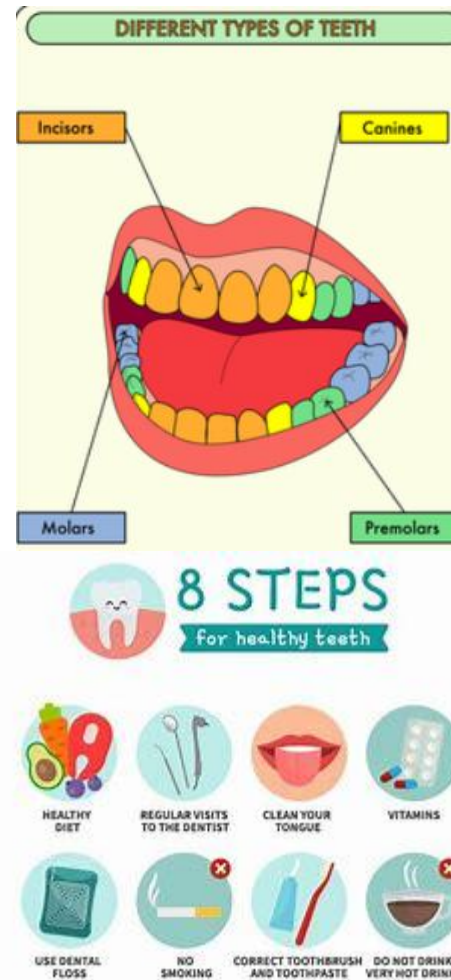
## Key Vocabulary

<b>Digestive system</b>	A series of structures and organs through which food and liquids pass during their processing into forms that can be absorbed into the bloodstream.
<b>Digestion</b>	The process of digesting food.
<b>Saliva</b>	Watery liquid secreted into the mouth by glands, providing lubrication for chewing and swallowing, and aiding digestion.
<b>Oesophagus</b>	Part of the digestive system which transports food from the back of the throat to the stomach.
<b>Stomach</b>	Organ that receives food that has been swallowed and begins digestion.
<b>Small intestine</b>	Joins the stomach to the large intestine.
<b>Nutrients</b>	Substances found in food essential for life and growth.
<b>Large intestine</b>	Turns food waste into stool ready to leave the body.
<b>Rectum</b>	Final section of large intestine.
<b>Anus</b>	The opening of the rectum.
<b>Incisor</b>	Sharp tooth used for cutting.
<b>Canine</b>	Pointed teeth between incisor and premolar.
<b>Molar</b>	Teeth used for grinding food.
<b>Premolar</b>	Teeth between canine and molar teeth.
